Programme overview



This program, delivered entirely in Spanish, has been jointly developed by Université Rennes 2, Europa-Universität Flensburg, and Universidade da Coruña. It brings together students from across the EMERGE European University alliance to explore the concept of coastal resilience.

Through an online preparatory phase followed by an international mobility programme, **participants will discover the environmental, cultural and linguistic characteristics of their respective territories, develop their intercultural and plurilingual competences in Spanish, and collaborate in international teams.**

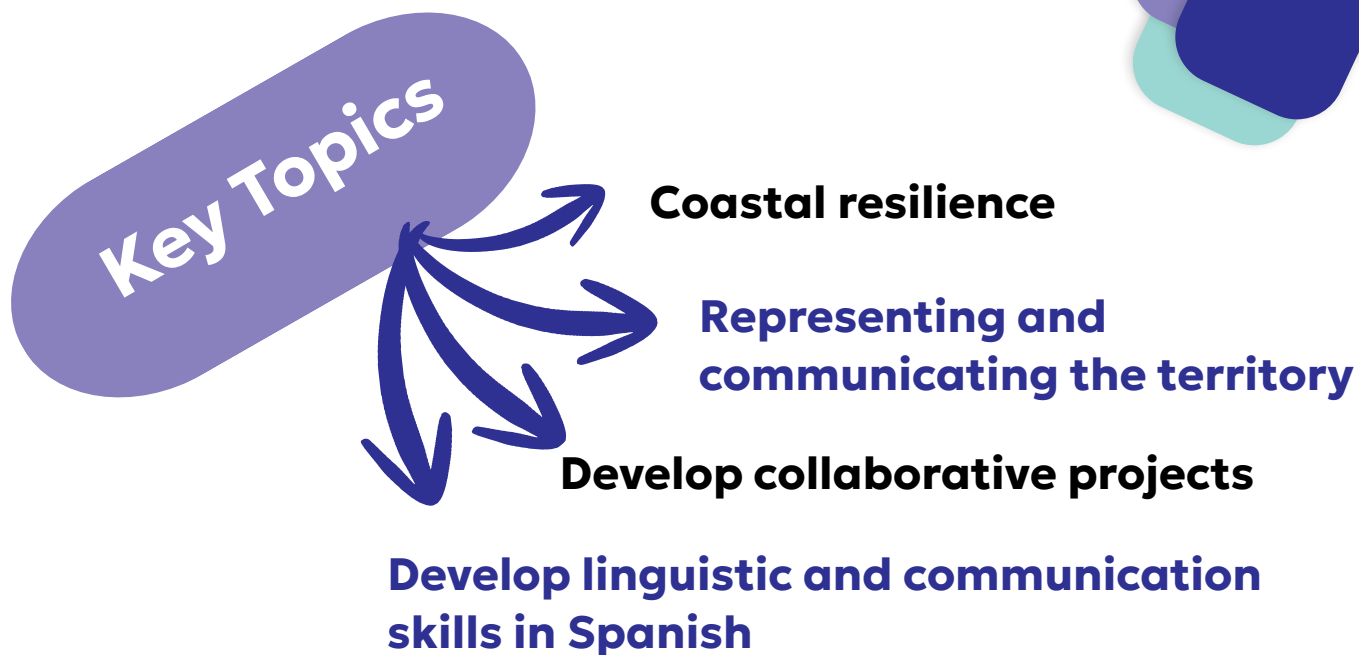
The project aims to foster a deeper understanding of the challenges facing European coastal areas while encouraging the exchange of knowledge, experiences and perspectives across borders.

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What will you learn?

By the end of the programme, you will be able to:

- Identify and describe the characteristics of the coastlines studied;
- Identify and compare the specific characteristics of the coastlines and regions of the partner universities;
- Explain the concept of coastal resilience and illustrate its main challenges using concrete examples;
- Draw on intercultural and language skills to communicate and collaborate with students from different backgrounds;
- Cooperate effectively within international groups as part of joint activities and projects.



Programme structure

- **Three half-day online sessions** (theory, speed-meeting, group project)
- **Five-day in-person workshop** at Université Rennes 2 (Mazier campus)
- Students will collaborate with peers from EMERGE partner universities to design original solutions to challenges given by the teachers on the topic of regenerative coastlines

Schedule

- | Online Session 1 | Between October 19 and 23
- | Online Session 2 | October 23
- | 5 days in-person at Université Rennes 2 | November 2 to 6
- | Online Session 3 | Between November 9 and 13

Who can apply ?

- Study level: Bachelor's or Master's degree from any discipline.
- Language requirement: Students must have at least a B2 level of Spanish.

- **This Blended Intensive Programme will be delivered in Spanish:** it offers an exciting opportunity to experience academic collaboration through a different language and cultural lens. **It reflects EMERGE's broader commitment to linguistic diversity** as a living, practiced value, not just a principle on paper. For participants, it is a chance to sharpen language skills in an academic setting, connect with peers and staff in new ways, and bring an extra dimension to their international learning experience.
- **This programme is open to participants from all disciplines and all partner institutions** with sufficient Spanish proficiency, whether gained through formal study, heritage background, prior exchange experience, or personal initiative. It is not limited to students of Spanish as an academic discipline.
- We are aware that not every partner university offers Spanish as a subject, and we want to be clear that this in no way limits eligibility: what matters is language proficiency, not institutional offering. **We warmly encourage all partners to nominate Spanish-speaking students and staff across their faculties.**
